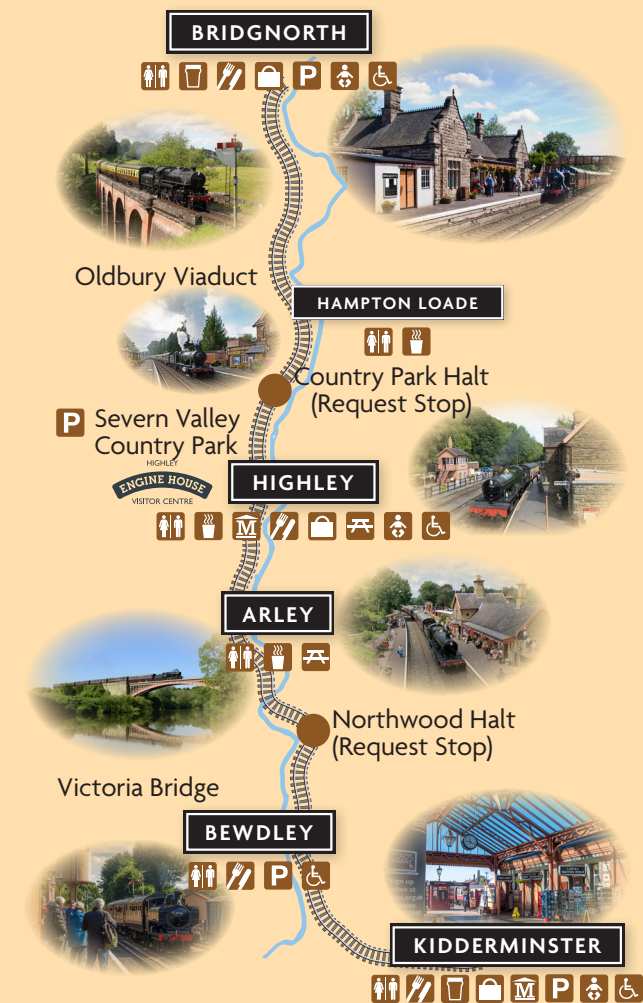
*The Diesel Multiple Unit (DMU) has limited accommodation for wheelchairs/mobility scooters/bicycles/pushchairs.

If you need step free access at Highley Station, please be at the platform at least 10 minutes before departure time. If you're travelling to Highley, please sit in the middle of the train, due to the short platform at the station.

REQUEST STOPS

If you wish to get off the train at Northwood or Country Park Halt, please inform the guard before joining the train. To join the train at Northwood or Country Park Halt, signal to the train with a horizontal arm extended in the air. Trains will only stop during daylight hours.

SAFETY ON THE SVR

DON'T PUSH OUR BUTTONS – THERE AREN'T ANY!

You might be more used to hi-tech 'Push Button to Open' when travelling on modern trains, but things weren't quite as easy, in the golden age of steam. Slam locks require a 90 degree turn to the vertical to open and provided the doors are closed firmly, will lock themselves. We do have a small number of other door locks that require manual turning of the handle to both open and close. If in doubt, seek staff assistance.



To open a door when standing inside the coach, first lower the droplight window by using either the sash or metal bar as provided. Check that the door is completely on the level part of the platform then carefully place your arm out of the window and turn the outside door handle, taking care not to lean against the door. **ONLY attempt to open doors when the train is stationary and you have checked it is at a level part of the platform.**

HEADS, SHOULDERS, KNEES AND TOES

Please keep all body parts inside the train at all times. There is a risk of you colliding with a static object (such as an over-hanging branch) or another train. Our locomotives also emit the occasional soot smut, not pleasant if you get one in your eye!



BE AWARE OF THE HERITAGE ENVIRONMENT!

We all need to let off steam from time to time, and steam locomotives are no different! Please be aware that sudden loud noises, escape of steam, soot, ash and diesel fumes are to be expected when operating a heritage locomotive fleet. Keep a look out as you travel!



LOOK LEFT, LOOK RIGHT

Barrow crossings are pedestrian walkways which cross the railway tracks. At Hampton Loade, passengers are asked to exercise care when using the crossing when changing platforms. Always give way to trains, and **NEVER** cross when a train is approaching. It's just like crossing the road!

PLEASE REMEMBER

1. **ONLY** attempt to open the doors when the train is stationary and you have checked it is at a level part of the platform.
2. **DO NOT** put your hands or body through open windows from inside the carriages when the train is in motion. Striking lineside structures or foliage can result in serious injury or worse.
